## THE PROJECT PROPOSAL

### THE TITLE OF THE PROPOSED PROJECT:

### **The Comprehensive Program for the Sustainable Development of Poor and Assetless People**

#### 1. ST. JOSEPH B.ED. COLLEGE

Women and Child Development Society (WCDS) has been running St. Joseph College of Education at Kadamboduvalu near Nanguneri in Tirunelveli District, Tamil Nadu. It is one year duration Bachelor of Education (B.Ed.) Course for degree passed students. The Govt. of India NCTE has given sanction to conduct the course. The sanction is accorded to the college to admit 100 girl students every year. This college is meant for girl students only. WCDS had opted to conduct classes only for girls keeping in mind the development of women in the future.

The college is admitting poor students from nearby villages with scholarships and some very poor students are admitted with fee concession. Some students are paying fees on instalments because their parents are very poor and daily coolie workers. Some students are very eager to study but at the same time they are not able to pay fees due to very poor income and poverty. The college admits those students without fees.

Under such circumstances the college has to manage the expenses of salary for teaching, non teaching staff, administrative staff members, other staff members, etc. with the fees collection from some affordable students. Due to very limited income from the students the college is unable to undertake developmental activities for the college. There is a need for additional building for class rooms, laboratory, library, staff rooms, dinning halls for the students and staff, recreation, indoor sports halls, etc.

WCDS requests assistance to construct buildings for class rooms, library, laboratory, staff rooms, dinning hall for the students and staff members, recreation centres, etc. to accommodate the additional students who are unable to pay the tuition and other fees, to the college.

## Objectives of the Project :

To provide quality employment oriented higher education to the students of poor and underprivileged sections of the society to ensure total development of the family and community. Free education will be provided to the poor and needy and the family need not suffer for borrowing loan for the education.

## 2. ST. JOSEPH TEACHER TRAINING INSTITUTE (D.T.ED.):

Women and Child Development Society (WCDS) has been running St. Joseph Teacher training Institute. It is two year duration Diploma in Teacher Education (D.T.Ed.) course for plus two passed students. The Govt. of India NCTE has given sanction to conduct the course. The sanction is accorded to the Institute to admit 100 girl students every year. This college is meant for girl students only. WCDS had opted to conduct classes only for girls keeping in mind the development of women in the future.

The Institute has been admitting poor students from the local and nearby villages with scholarships and some very poor students are admitted with fee concession. Some students are paying fees on instalments because their parents are very poor and daily coolie workers. Some students are very eager to study but at the same time they are not able to pay fees due to very poor income and poverty. The college admits those students without fees.

Under such circumstances the Institute has been managing the expenses of salary for teaching, non teaching staff, administrative staff members, other staff members, etc. with very limited income by way of fees from some affordable students. With the very limited

income from the students the Institute is unable to undertake developmental activities for the Institute. ### **3. ST. JOSEPH C.B.S.E. SCHOOL**

Women and Child Development Society (WCDS) have been running St. Joseph C.B.S.E School at Kadamboduvalvu village (via) Nanguneri, Tirunelveli district with the approval from the Department of Education, Government of Tamilnadu. Now the classes are conducted from Kinder garden to 5<sup>th</sup> standard. The rich and affordable parents are sending their children to the city schools aiming good education, spoken English, computer application, library, laboratory, sports and games facilities, etc. WCDS wanted to give the same quality education to poor rural children. The school follows the Central Government's CBSE Syllabus with continuous comprehensive evaluation system.

The school provides motherly care and full protection to students, enchanting natural environment with spacious playground, Montessori method of teaching to toddlers, well ventilated comfortable class rooms, modern library, hi-tech science lab, computer lab and language lab, English speaking skill development by native English speakers and Anglo Indian teachers, development of life skills swimming, skating, karate, dance and music, art and craft, indoor and outdoor stadium for games, sports and physical exercises, development of total personality and leadership qualities, character building and world class education, periodical feed back and review meetings of parents and teachers, enjoyable life-oriented learning, bus facilities to all the surrounding villages, protected drinking water, etc. Qualified, experienced, efficient and dedicated teachers conduct the classes.

The school has been admitting students from the local and nearby villages. The majority of the parents are unable to pay the tuition and other fees. Very poor students are admitted with fee concession and some students are paying fees on instalments because their parents are very poor and daily coolie workers. Some students are very eager to study but at the same time they are unable to pay fees due to very poor income and poverty. The school admits those students without fees.

The school has been managing the expenses of salary for teaching, non teaching staff, administrative staff members, other staff members, etc. with very limited income by way of fees from some affordable students. With the very limited income from the students the school is unable to undertake developmental activities for the school. The school requires additional building for class rooms, laboratory, library, staff rooms, dinning halls for the students and staff, recreation, indoor sports halls, auditorium, etc.

#### 4. COACHING CENTRES & CAREER GUIDANCE AND COUNSELLING TO GRADUATE YOUTHS:

Women and Child Development Society (WCDS) is interested in the education and employment of poor youth in general and rural youth in particular. Some students complete degree courses and do not have idea about their future. Majority of the educated youths come from poor family background and majority of the parents do not have financial background to send for higher education. They are not aware of competitive examinations the students should appear and come out successful to get employment in the Government. There are coaching centres functioning in the cities and towns and they collect fees for the coaching. The majority of the parents could not afford to pay the fees for the coaching centres. Sometimes, travel expenses up and down to the coaching centre prevents from joining the centre.

Keeping in mind the employment of educated youths WCDS wants to start coaching centres and career guidance and counselling centres to graduate youths.

It will guide the educated students to select the suitable employment and potential companies for the selection of jobs.

Coaching and career guidance and counseling centres to graduate youths requires rented building, salary for staff, stipend and travel expenses, furniture, computer, printer, stationery & printing, etc.

### **Objectives of the Project :**

To start career guidance and counselling centres to provide quality career guidance and counselling to the students of poor and underprivileged sections of the society free of cost. To enlighten the choice of right career and undergo coaching in an interested subject. The family need not worry in borrowing loan for the coaching and career guidance centre.

### **5. TUITION CENTRES FOR POOR STUDENTS:**

Women and Child Development Society (WCDS) is interested in the education of people in general and rural children in particular. Majority of the students come from poor family background and majority of both the parents are literates and semi-literates. However the parents are interested in sending their children to the schools. But they were not able to help and guide their children in doing the home work. Some of the children manage the home work and majority of the students could not do the home work. This makes them unpleasant situation in front of other students in the class room. Since some of the students could not get sufficient marks in the examination, they fail and discontinue the schooling.



In some villages tuition centres are run by educated youths and they collect tuition fees. Majority of the parents could not pay the tuition fees and students could not attend the centres.

The organization wanted to avoid such a situation it has arranged tuition centres in the villages with the help of educated girls and boys in the villages to help these students to do home work and educational help. The centres are conducted either in a common place or in the house of the tuition teachers. The tuition teachers are paid by the organization and periodic visits are made to these villages to monitor the centres.

**The Objectives :**

- To provide tuition and tuition facilities to the poor children in the villages
- To encourage the village poor students to continue the education.
- To minimize the financial burden of poor parents for tuition

**The Activities :**

- Tuition centres will be started in the villages.
- A tuition teacher will be appointed in each village.
- Black board, Lighting, sports materials, etc. will be provided

**Budget estimate :**

## **6. PROGRAMME FOR HELPING SENIOR CITIZENS:**

The people who have worked hard and suffered for the wellbeing of the families are suffering from poverty, lack of support, negligence of family members, societies, etc. These old age people are affected by diseases such as heart diseases, diabetics, piles, tuberculosis, asthma, knee and angle problems, etc. They require not only shelter, food, clothing, etc. but also medical treatment, medicines, etc. The senior citizens are eagerly waiting for the love, affection, care, etc. from the family members in general and sons in particular. Some of the families due to poor income and poverty they are not able to take care of the old age people. In those families, the aged people have no other alternative except joining the old age homes which are run on charity. But in some families due to employment and business the sons are employed in foreign countries and in various cities in the country. Under such circumstances the family members could not give attention and care to the aged people. Under such circumstances they leave their aged parents in the old age homes and meet the expenses.

### **The Objectives of the Project :**

To provide social security, accommodation, food, clothing, medical care, entertainment, etc.

### **The Proposed Activities - Senior Citizens :**

Old age home will be established along with day care centre. Cots, beds, pillows, bed sheets, towels, etc. will be provided in the home. Food will be served for the aged people who stay in the home and for the aged people who come for the day care centre. Dresses will be provided to them. Medical care, such as treatment, medicines, etc. will be arranged for the needy senior citizens. More over periodical medical check up will also be conducted to the all the old aged people. Physiotherapy clinics and counseling will be organized in the home for the needy aged people. They will be taken to outing to ease their tension and make them feel happy. They will be given love and affection, over all care and protection, as they enjoy if they are with the family.

### **7. REHABILITATION PROGRAMMES FOR DISABLED PEOPLE :**

#### **The Causes for Disability:**

The major causes of disability are malnutrition, communicable diseases, infection in early childhood and accidents at home and at work. Nutritional deficiencies, inadequate sanitation, insufficient or inaccessible health care services, accidents and injuries from poorly designed equipment and implements, and practices like consanguineous marriages, have all contributed to a high prevalence of disabilities. Immunization programmes have not yet achieved 100% coverage, due partly to inadequate infrastructure, logistical problems and difficulties in maintaining the cold chain and partly to the lack of public education on the subject.

**Disability and Rural People:**

About 80% of people with disabilities in India are in the rural areas. The rural poor are particularly at risk of those disabilities, which are associated with malnutrition, poor condition of environmental sanitation and communicable diseases. Accidents arising from negligence, ignorance and lack of safety measures are also major causes for disabilities. Persons with disabilities are heterogeneous groups composed of those who born with disability, those who acquire a disability following micro-nutritional deficiencies as well as those who became disabled as a result of accident. However, whatever their degree of disability they have the same basic needs of the age, gender, economic and socio-cultural group which they belong.

**Biased Distribution of Welfare Services:**

While the majority of the Indians with disabilities live in rural areas, available services are limited to urban centers. It is estimated that only 2% to 3% persons in need of rehabilitation have access to these facilities and services.

**Gender Discrimination:**

In general the persons with disabilities are more marginalized than other and tend to be left out of the development stream. Women and girls with disabilities are handicapped not only by negative attitudes towards disability, but also by gender discrimination and poverty. Where services and programmes for disabled persons do exist, it is the men and boys who are primary beneficiaries. Women & girls with disabilities are largely excluded from the main stream of women's movement and from development programmes targeted at poor women, as well as from the self-help and organizations of disabled people.

### **The Objectives of the Programme :**

The disabled people should be given the confidence and the social security for normal life as other citizens of the country. They should be given equal opportunity in education, skill training, employment, credit facilities, equipments, as others get and enjoy.

### **The proposed activities :**

Community based rehabilitation, special school, vocational and technical skill training, credit facilities, income generation activities, equipments for their disability, awareness programmes, for disabled and the general public, etc.

### **8. HELP FOR WOMEN IN DISTRESS**

Women and Child Development Society (WCDS) aims at the well being of the women. It works for the development of women in general and distressed women in particular. The joint family system is still existing which often causes for family disputes, misunderstanding between husbands and wives, dowry harassment, domestic violence, gender discrimination sex violence etc. The women become victims of the oppression

and deserted from families. She sometimes come out of the families with her child (ren) due to intolerable situation in the families. The women will be stranded and may not have a dwelling place. The situation will further affect them in the hands of anti social elements. Therefore, the affected women need asylum to live and food and other basic requirements. The women need to be given counselling to relieve from the stress and to give the confidence to face the challenges and continue to live in the society.

WCDS knew the sufferings of the women in dress and guide them to stay in the short stay homes or swadhar homes for women in dress. It guides them to join self help groups and help them to join technical skill training institute to undergo training on preparation of readymade garments, production of fur toys, Chisel and banana fibre materials, vermin compost, etc.

WCDS wants to start home for women in dress and conduct vocational and skill training centres apart from opening of counselling centres for the women in distress.

#### **The Objectives of the Project :**

The destitute women and children should be given opportunities to lead a peaceful and pleasant life. They need counseling, awareness trainings and skill trainings to earn sustainable income to manage the family. The women should be given credit facilities to start income generation activities. The marketing facilities for their products should be arranged for assured income. They should enjoy a sense of security and peaceful living.

#### **The Proposed Activities :**

The destitute women should be given a safe place for dwelling with her children. They will be given food, clothing, medical check up, These women require counseling to bring them to the normal life since they are continuously affected by quarrel, conflict, etc. in the family. They should be given general awareness to understand the society and the people around us. The women should be given technical and skill training to start some income generation activities for sustainable development.

**9. SKILL TRAINING ON SOFT SKILLS :**

Women and Child Development Society (WCDS) is interested in the education and employment of poor youth in general and rural female youth in particular. Some of the students complete degree courses and try for some employment. The employment may not be available immediately in the nearby towns and cities. Moreover now-a-days just graduation is not sufficient to get a suitable job. The youths should have some additional skills such as computer application, hardware and software, office management, account management, etc. This kind of additional skills will enable the youths to get employment as early as possible. Therefore the organization has guided and helped them to join and get training on soft skills.

**The Objectives :**

- To provide some technical skill to enable the educated youth in general and young women in particular.
- To give them the confidence they could find a job and continue in the job.

**Activities Proposed :**

The training on computer application, software, hardware, administration, accounting, documentation, etc. will be given to the youths of both sex to find wage employment or self employment.

**10 ENVIRONMENT PROTECTION AND TREE PLANTATION:**

Women and Child Development Society (WCDS) aims at the environment protection and tree plantation. Extended duration of summer, increasing warming, continuous drought, flood, cyclone, tsunami, earth quake, etc. are happening in different parts of the world as an ordinary incidents. When we study the reasons for quick and often climate change, it is imperative that it is not natural but it is created. The present climate change and destruction are mainly due to global warming. Climate change and global warming are the outcome of two main things. First is excessive use of petrol, diesel and gas and the second point is destruction of forests by cutting of trees. This causes global warming



and leads to climate change and melting of ice of Arctic and Antarctic regions. Our forefathers left the very safe earth to us and it is our duty to pass it on to our successors.

The only alternative to prevent global warming and climate is planting of more and more trees and develop forest cover. Therefore WCDS conducts awareness meetings and explains the importance of tree plantation and distributes free saplings to the people to plant in the houses, farms, offices, etc.

**The Objectives :**

- To conduct awareness programmes among the general public about the environment pollution and the need to protect the environment.
- Raising of nursery plants and distribution to the people.

**Activities Proposed :**

Awareness Programmes in the sub-urban, urban town and cities will be conducted to create awareness among the general public.

**11. AGRICULTURE DEVELOPMENT:**

Women and Child Development Society (WCDS) aims at the development of agriculture activities. India is an agriculture country and approximately 70% of the people are involved in agriculture and agriculture allied activities. Green revolution was introduced in Agriculture and agricultural inputs such as chemical fertilizers and pesticides were used continuously to get good yield. Initially there was good return and in the long run

the return in agriculture reduced. The farmers could not get the expected output and met with loss in agriculture. Majority of the farmers could not return the loan amount with interest and became debt. The problem was the excessive use of chemical fertilizers and pesticides with the expectation of more return. It has affected the fertility of the soil and the land became almost barren. The farmers have left the ecological farming using organic manure and pest control methods. Now the farmers realized the mistake of use of chemical fertilizers and now willing to return to organic farming methods.

WCDS is involved in creating awareness among farmers regarding adoption of ecological farming, preparation and use organic manure, etc. It is giving training and orientation to the farmers about the production and application of organic manure and vermin compost. Rotation of crops, inter crop system, etc. are explained to the farmers to maximise the yield and get good return.

**The Objectives :**

- To create awareness about the degradation of agricultural land among farmers
- To encourage the farmers to go for ecological farming
- To train the farmers to produce organic manure and vermin compost.
- To make use of organic manure and pesticides.

**The Activities:**

- Organize awareness meetings among farmers and the general public
- Encourage the farmers to start ecological farming methods
- Training the farmers and the general public to produce organic manure & vermin compost.
